Coreopsis, Tickseed

Tickseeds are a diverse group of North American natives known for their colorful floral characteristics. Various shades of yellow dominate the genus; however, numerous introductions bear pinks, reds, maroons, whites and bi-colors with dark centers and bright tips. The floral colors and textures are truly amazing. Tickseeds are naturals for full sun and well-drained soils. This small sampling does not do justice to the potpourri found in the marketplace. **BIG BANG™ Series** features diverse flower colors and sterile flowers that won't seed in the garden. **'Cosmic Evolution'**

PP22943 (creamy white with magenta hues); **'Cosmic Eye'** **PP22601** (yellow blossoms with burgundy eyes); **'Galaxy'** **PP21999** (semi-double and double canary yellow flowers); and **'Mercury Rising'** **PP24689** (velvety wine red blooms) are a few of the introductions. The **BIG BANG™ Series** is recommended for **Zone 5**. **SATIN & LACE™ Series** features **'Berry Chiffon'** **PP27414**, a long bloomer with white flowers and red raspberry eyes, and **'Red Chiffon'** **PP27528**, yellow flowers with scarlet red eyes. The **SATIN & LACE™ Series** is recommended for **Zone 4**. **grandiflora** **'Early Sunrise'** has golden yellow semi-double flowers with orange yellow centers. **grandiflora** **'Sunray'** is a compact plant with semi-double and double deep golden yellow flowers. **verticillata** **'Moonbeam'** has lemon yellow flowers on top of needle-like foliage and **verticillata** **'Zagreb'** is a bushy plant with bright golden yellow flowers and needle-like foliage.

Corydalis lutea, Yellow Corydalis

Yellow Corydalis is a colonizing ground cover ranging from 9"-15" tall. Blue-green fern-like leaves are graced with golden yellow flowers from late spring to mid-fall. It prefers partial to full shade with low or adequate moisture; however, it will grow under full sun if provided ample moisture. Yellow Corydalis is a self-seeder and may expand its boundaries.

Crocusmia 'Lucifer'

Crocusmia, Crocosmia

Crocusmia is noted for its sword-shaped leaves reaching upward to 3' with arching stems of colorful funnel shaped blooms in July and August. It grows best under full sun and in moist well-drained soil; however, it will tolerate partial shade. Here are some popular selections. **'Bright Eyes'** has bright orange flowers with scarlet red eyes. **'Emily McKenzie'** hosts orange red flowers with crimson throats in mid-late summer. **'Lucifer'** has bright scarlet red flowers along characteristic arching stems. **'Walberton Yellow'** has large upright golden yellow flowers on its graceful arching stems.
